# Workshop: Understanding College Financial Aid and Paying for College Saturday, October 22, 2022, 10 to 11:30 AM (English)

Learn about the different types of financial aid and how to choose a college you can afford.

Do you know if you'll qualify for need-based aid? Do you know how to find colleges that will award scholarships based on your student's grades and academic qualifications? Are you confident you can pay for four years of college without the student or the parents taking on excessive debt? Attend this session to learn how to answer these questions. Take control of your student's college cost by making sure the student has a list of affordable colleges before he or she applies. This presentation takes the mystery out of financial aid and college costs.

## Topics include:

- New changes coming to the FAFSA
- Types of aid: grants, scholarships, work/study, loans.
- How do colleges decide how much aid to give?
- Need- and merit-based aid, what's the difference, how to get it?
- What do you need to know about financial aid applications: the FAFSA and the Profile forms?
- Using net price calculators to estimate your cost after aid at any college.
- Estimating the 4-year bottom line: how much will you pay for a college degree?
- How can you estimate how much college debt you'll need?
- How can you decide if college debt is reasonable and affordable?

### Presented by Bill Smith, Managing Director, ScholarFITS LLC

Smith worked with colleges to program their financial aid policies into online financial aid estimators known as Net Price Calculators. His clients included Bowdoin, MIT, the University of Arkansas, Yale, and many others. Bill became an expert at determining eligibility for need-based aid using both the FAFSA and the CSS Profile methods. He learned how colleges decide how much merit and need-based aid to award, and the mix of grants, scholarships, loans, and workstudy. He operates ScholarFITS LLC, working with families throughout the US from his office in Portland Maine. Smith's BA is from Williams College, he has an MBA from Northwestern University and a Certificate in College Counseling from UCLA.



## **Reminders**

**Blue Cards:** We need to have a digital blue card on file for every student. If you have not filled out the blue card, please do so **here**. Parents will not be able to access their NYC Schools Account without this. (And, that NYC SA will take some time to set up.)

**Lunch Form:** Everyone gets free lunch, however, our kids need to **fill out their lunch forms ASAP**, as it determines something far more important - Fee Waivers for SAT/ACT tests, College Applications and AP Exams. School Day PSAT and SAT are free for everyone. Every family has to fill this out every year. You can decide not to submit financial information, but please fill out and check that box.

**Students' Email**: Please go to the **BTHS.edu** website for information on how to set up student email accounts. Use your **NYCStudents.net** account for information and schedules (see next item).

**Students' Schedules:** Your student should have received their schedules online. They are available through **Teach Hub** after they sign in with their NYCStudents.net account.

**Emergency Contact Information:** All families must update their info, in particular, their emergency contact information and student's health information, in the **NYC Schools Account**. This is different from the blue card, so we need full participation.

**Parents:** Because PupilPath is no longer used, you can follow your child's progress and grades on **the NYC Schools Account** (NYCSA). If you need need a creation code, please contact parent coordinator **MaryHuhn**. Please be patient, and Mary will get it for you.

**Gym Uniforms**: BTHS gear will be required for P.E. this year. Students can buy uniform items at the S.G.O. store on the 7th floor during the second week of school. Please wait for more information from your P.E. teacher.
