### Recap from Previous Tech Talk:

Tech will be offering the hybrid remote model that has in person instruction for each student every 4 days, 25% of the students coming in each day with additional in person time for social emotional learning, advisory, and meeting with guidance counselors. Daily synchronous instruction are planned. Students will likely follow a schedule at home as well as in school. There will be daily live teacher office hours as well. Inperson classroom experience will focus largely on the labs, hands on classes, major classes, specialty classes, and electives.


Families also have the choice to opt-in to an all-remote schedule next fall. Families will have the option to transition to hybrid blending learning during set time periods for their child. Families who opt for all remote in the fall, will be taught by Brooklyn Tech teachers and be in classes with Brooklyn Tech students.

# Class of 2021 Senior Portraits



Dear Seniors and Parents of the Class of 2021:

Our Yearbook Advisor Mr. Johnston has set up a yearbook photo sitting at the Portrait USA Studio because the photographers are not allowed to enter Brooklyn Tech at this time due to Covid restrictions. The photos are in a normal circumstance taken during Regents week in the café.

Here are some things you need to know from Portraits USA:

- All staff from the studio will be wearing masks
- All props will be sanitized between students handling them.
- The gowns will be cleaned by a UV cleaning product between students wearing and handling them.
- No other school will be at the session besides Brooklyn Tech students
- Everyone must be 6 feet apart and enter wearing a mask
- The \$10.00 covers the cost of the studio rental space (larger studio rented for the size of our class)
- The company is hoping that session will be in 15 minute intervals. The amount of students inside will be limited.
- Get there on time for your time slot-so there is not a waiting period.
- Bring something to do in case you do have to wait a bit.
- The photographers will tell you how to move verbally only.
- Dates for pictures will be added throughout August. The dates must be staggered due to the size of our class and Covid Guidelines.
- To secure your spot the company does ask for a credit card. This is legit.
- To make an appointment, click the school scheduling link below to select a date and time! There is a \$10 sitting fee due when getting photographed that can be paid in advance online, in EXACT cash, or by check or money order when getting photographed. ## 1) BTHS Library Summer Passion Project

With the lack of summer jobs, internships, and other opportunities in 2020, students are looking for ways to learn and expand their experiences while at home. An independent passion project (aka 20% time project) is a great way to take advantage of this time to delve into personal interests and it also shows student initiative. Passion Projects that involve research and learning can be shared with teachers who write recommendation letters, be incorporated into college essays, and included on college applications.

The Summer Passion Project program involves a student (or a group of students) developing their own project and learning about something they are passionate about, but also sharing the learning in a way that could be useful or potentially useful, and reflecting on their experience.

Students in the program are following their own desires to learn and reach out, mixing and matching among their diverse interests. The projects include time spent learning through books, research articles, interviews, testing, etc. Students in the program are writing and sharing songs, blogs, websites, stories and a novel, poems, computer code, interviewing alumni, teaching classes and mentoring projects for younger students, doing a Ted Talk, making and editing videos, making masks, and starting a baking business. Some will be learning and teaching about the Chinese Exclusion Act, food science, fogponics, gentrification, current politics, the crisis in Yemen, comparing Covid in different countries, discrimination in health care, climate change, how to reduce plastic in businesses, sharing college advice, staying organized with schoolwork, how not to raise a serial killer, photography, how to make miso and more!

While the deadline has passed to sign up, students can do their own passion projects and submit them for sharing; there is still almost a month before projects are due.

If you are interested in sharing your Passion Project with the school community, please mail your finished presentation (Video file, PowerPoint, Google Slides, Presi, etc.) to the <u>BTHS Library</u> by Aug 25th; we can't wait to see it!


