

Diversity Committee Book Club

The next selection for the Diversity Committee Book Club is *The Narrows* by Ann Petry. This book was chosen with Black History Month in mind. The author (October 12, 1908 – April 28, 1997) was the first black woman writer with book sales topping a million copies for her novel *The Street*.

Goodreads description of *The Narrows*: When Link Williams, a college-educated twenty-six-year-old African-American man, falls for Camilo Sheffield, a wealthy married white woman, things will never be the same in the sleepy New England town of Monmouth, Connecticut. Set in the 1950s, this unforgettable classic deftly evokes a tragic love affair and offers a window onto the powerful ways in which class, race, and love intersected in midcentury America.
