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Nominating Committee Selected for

Parent Association Executive Board Elections

A big "Thank You" to everyone who responded to our message last week seeking volunteers to serve on a Nominating Committee. Thanks to your participation, the Executive Board has already successfully empaneled a Nominating Committee.

In the weeks to come, the Nominating Committee will be canvassing the PA membership for eligible candidates to serve as officers of the PA Executive Board. Executive Board offices include: President or Co-Presidents, Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer, Co-Recording Secretaries, Co-Corresponding Secretaries, Co-VPs for Fund Raising, Co-VPs for Events & Volunteers, Co-VPs for Diversity, Co-VPs for Communications, Co-Senior Class Parent Reps, Co-Junior Class Parent Reps, Co-Sophomore Class Parent Reps and 5 Freshman Class Reps, totaling 26 seats. All parents or guardians of currently enrolled BTHS students are eligible to run for an office. Further details are also available in the BTHS PA By-Laws, available at this link. Serving a an officer on the PA Executive Board is an excellent way to volunteer to serve the school community.

Normally, PA Executive Board officer elections are held each Spring before the end of each school year. But this year, because on-site, in-person PA meetings were cancelled due to COVID, the Chancellor ordered elections be deferred to the fall. The PA expects to designate a nominating committee before Labor Day; the nominating committee will then coordinate with the current PA executive board to hold an election later in September. Several of the current members of the exec board will be "graduating" with their kids this year or moving on to other commitments; other current members may also run for re-election. The Executive Board encourages everyone who is highly motivated to contribute to their kids' educational experience at Tech and wishes to stay in close touch with events at the school to volunteer for service with the PA. It's absolutely the best forum for parents to exchange views, organize and stay informed about the academic and social environment for their kids at Tech! School Opening Plans - Updates

9月开学计划 -- 更新消息



On Friday Principal Newman announced that students participating in the hybrid instructional model will soon be notified which days they will be scheduled to attend classes in the school building during the Fall semester.

On Thursday August 20 New York City Mayor DeBlasio and Chancellor of Schools Richard Carranza announced the city's Back-to-School Pledge outlining the city's safety and health commitments to students, parents, and the school community prior to the start of the school year.

The New York City Back-to-School Pledge 2020

Health and Safety Always Come First

- Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and cleaning supplies will be supplied to all schools, and the New York City Department of Education (DOE) will have a 30-day supply on hand at all times with a hotline for principals to call for immediate resupply for their schools.
- There will be 2 full-time nurses on duty in the Tech school building.
- Any school building or room that does not have adequate ventilation will not be used by students or staff.
- Students and staff will practice physical distancing in all school buildings.
- Students will remain in pods for as much of the day as possible.
- Students and staff will wear face coverings throughout the school day; if they do not have them, they will be provided for free.
- Hand sanitizer will be available in every classroom.
- City-run testing sites will prioritize free COVID testing and expedited results for school staff; free testing is also available to all students, families, and New Yorkers citywide.
- DOE is encouraging all DOE employees to be tested monthly.
- NYC Department of Health and Test + Trace Corps will immediately investigate confirmed cases to prevent spread of the virus.
- Schools will communicate with all students and families when there are confirmed cases in schools.
- When necessary, classrooms or school buildings will temporarily close to maintain safety of school communities and prevent spread of the virus.
- School buildings will close if the percentage of positive COVID-19 tests in New York City is 3% or more using a 7-day average.

NYC Public Schools Will be Cleaned and Disinfected, Day and Night

- All school buildings will be disinfected overnight, every night.
- High-touch zones will be cleaned multiple times throughout each day.

 Electrostatic disinfectors will clean surfaces daily with zero physical contact.

Students Will be Learning Five Days a Week, No Matter What

- Whether in-person or online, students will study in supportive environments with rigorous academic standards.
- Remote students will still interact with their teachers every day.
- Student schedules both remote and in-person will be preset and consistent to allow families to plan.
- Academic instruction will integrate social-emotional learning and trauma-informed care to support students holistically.
- Teachers will have a 20-minute "office period" aach day to engage one-on-one with students and families.


Tech students can get a Brooklyn Public Library card or a NY Public Library card regardless of which borough they live in. Find information on public library ecards here.

For students that have school books at home (textbooks/library books): We are still waiting for plans to get back books that students have at home from last year. Please continue to hold onto them.


One School / One Book
