Online Workshop: Strategies for Writing the College App Essay 7:00 - 8:30 PM, Thursday, Oct. 6, 2022


Participants will learn effective writing strategies and read successful models for writing the personal narrative, which is very different from the academic analysis and argument most high school students are trained in. Particularly, language choices are very different, as is the role of tone, and organization. Also, the college app essay asks people to share, to delve into themselves, and some students struggle with this inner journey. Awareness o all of the above can help the student and parent find the process more rewarding than stressful.

The talk will address how to write the essay as well as the contingent challenges/opportunities that come with writing personal narratives for college admissions.

Jonathan Shapiro has been helping students write as a teacher and tutor for more than 20 years. His tutees have been accepted to the most select schools, including Harvard, Princeton, Stanford, Yale, MIT, NYU, Cornell, and many, many more.

Jonathan's BA is in English from Rutgers College and his MFAs are from Sarah Lawrence College and the University of Washington. Currently, Jonathan teaches writing and literature at Fordham University and tutors writing for college application essays and academic and creative writing.

Reminders

Blue Cards: We need to have a digital blue card on file for every student. If you have not filled out the blue card, please do so **here**. Parents will not be able to access their NYC Schools Account without this. (And, that NYC SA will take some time to set up.)

Lunch Form: Everyone gets free lunch, however, our kids need to **fill out their lunch forms ASAP**, as it determines something far more important - Fee Waivers for SAT/ACT tests, College Applications and AP Exams. School Day PSAT and SAT are free for everyone. Every family has to fill this out every year. You can decide not to submit financial information, but please fill out and check that box.

Students' Email: Please go to the BTHS.edu website for information on how to set up student

email accounts. Use your **NYCStudents.net** account for information and schedules (see next item).

Students' Schedules: Your student should have received their schedules online. They are available through **Teach Hub** after they sign in with their NYCStudents.net account.

Emergency Contact Information: All families must update their info, in particular, their emergency contact information and student's health information, in the **NYC Schools Account**. This is different from the blue card, so we need full participation.

Parents: Because PupilPath is no longer used, you can follow your child's progress and grades on **the NYC Schools Account** (NYCSA). If you need need a creation code, please contact parent coordinator **MaryHuhn**. Please be patient, and Mary will get it for you.

Gym Uniforms: BTHS gear will be required for P.E. this year. Students can buy uniform items at the S.G.O. store on the 7th floor during the second week of school. Please wait for more information from your P.E. teacher.
