The October PA general meeting was held on **Thursday**, **October 20**, **2022 at 6 PM** in the library at BTHS.



Social Justice/Racial Equity Book Club


Wednesday, November 9, 7 PM

The Tech PA's Social Justice/Racial Equity Book Club is happy to announce that the first book discussion will be about *Sissy: A Coming of Gender Story* by Jacob Tobia.

"Sissy is a complex, introspective piece about gender and sexuality and how society's view can impact self-worth. Jacob Tobia recounts experiences throughout their life that have impacted them in the manner of their gender and sexuality and their self-acceptance. A heart-wrenching, eye-opening and giggle-inducing memoir about what it's like to grow up not sure if you're (a) a boy, (b) a girl, (c) something in between, or (d) all of the above."

This meeting will not be recorded as this is a safe spaceintended to be free of bias, conflict, criticism, or potentially threatening actions, ideas, or conversations. We ask that everyone be respectful as we have these difficult, uncomfortable, but necessary discussions.

We will be joined by a special guest, **Erin Kyle**, who started her gender transition in her 40s. Erin will share her own life experience and reflection. See you there!
