Fall Reopening Updates

秋季返校计划最新消息



Top of mind for everyone at Brooklyn Tech this summer is "what's going to happen in the Fall?" Well, Principal Newman has formed a committee that meets weekly to discuss all the possibilities for Fall instruction. The committee includes a representative from the PA, a representative from the School Leadership Team and a parent-at-large, among others. Mr Newman has promised to send out an email every Tuesday to update Tech families. In his latest email, dated July 21, Mr. Newman described a plan that will allow 25% of the students in the building each day on a rolling basis; under this plan each participating student will be in the building for instruction once every 4 days. This plan for a blended combination of inperson and remote instruction is designed to maximize the number of people that can safely, with social distancing, occupy the building at one time. In conjunction with the rotating attendance schedule, the school is also developing more robust plans for the remote instruction that will be the cornerstone of at least 75% of the students' educational experience next year. In addition, plans accommodate periods of time when the school or the district might need to transition to full remote. Finally, any family that wishes to may opt for a 100% fully remote learning environment for their student(s). There will be several specific dates during the school year when families under the full-remote program can opt to switch to the blended remote-in person plan, but those dates have not been released yet. Families wishing to adopt the full remote option should fill out this survey before August 7. On the other hand, any family starting out under the blended program may switch to full-remote instruction at will at any time.

Mr. Newman reported that these plans were submitted to the New York City Department of Education ("DOE") for review and consideration on Thursday, July 23. For the latest information available from DOE, you may take a look at the DOE "Return to School 2020" webpage. Also, DOE will be hosting a city-wide information session with the Chancellor and Executive Superintendents from 6:30 to 8:00 p.m. on July 28, 2020; we encourage all BTHS families to pre-register!

1) BTHS Library Summer Passion Project

With the lack of summer jobs, internships, and other opportunities in 2020, students are looking for ways to learn and expand their experiences while at home. An independent passion project (aka 20% time project) is a great way to take advantage of this time to delve into personal interests and it also shows student initiative. Passion Projects that involve research and learning can be shared with teachers who write recommendation letters, be incorporated into college essays, and included on college applications.

The Summer Passion Project program involves a student (or a group of students) developing their own project and learning about something they are passionate about, but also sharing the learning in a way that could be useful or potentially useful, and reflecting on their experience.

Students in the program are following their own desires to learn and reach out, mixing and matching among their diverse interests. The projects include time spent learning through books, research articles, interviews, testing, etc. Students in the program are writing and sharing songs, blogs, websites, stories and a novel, poems, computer code, interviewing alumni, teaching classes and mentoring projects for younger students, doing a Ted Talk, making and editing videos, making masks, and starting a baking business. Some will be learning and teaching about the Chinese Exclusion Act, food science, fogponics, gentrification, current politics, the crisis in Yemen, comparing Covid in different countries, discrimination in health care, climate change, how to reduce plastic in businesses, sharing college advice, staying organized with schoolwork, how not to raise a serial killer, photography, how to make miso and more!

While the deadline has passed to sign up, students can do their own passion projects and submit them for sharing; there is still almost a month before projects are due.

If you are interested in sharing your Passion Project with the school community, please mail your finished presentation (Video file, PowerPoint, Google Slides, Presi, etc.) to the <u>BTHS Library</u> by Aug 25th; we can't wait to see it!


