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# **Back To School Updates**

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## Safety

Make sure your students take their temperatures at home before they come in. If there are any symptoms of sickness in the household or the student does not pass the health screening please stay home. Each student must complete the health screening prior to arriving at school each day. It can be found here, see printable form here if needed. See additional email about entry/moving/exit procedures for blended students if needed.

Please remember that masks are mandatory, and must be worn inside the building at all times. Gaiters or bandanas are not acceptable, and masks must *not* have any sort of exhalation valve without a filter. Please see Principal Newman's email about updated Bell Schedules/Textbook Return Schedules.

### **Learning tools survey**

Please all families fill out this survey to let us know if you have all the tools you need for remote learning. It is a short survey that asks if you have an online device with a camera and microphone to use at home, and WIFI access.

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#### Update for Families on COVID-19 Testing

Per DOE, testing in schools will begin in October. In order for us to administer a COVID-19 test to your child, we need your consent. We strongly encourage you to sign and return the attached consent form as soon as possible. If your child is tested, we will let you know they were tested and when and how you will receive the results, which will typically be provided within 48-72 hours. Please refer to this email for specific questions. You can reach out to the school at any time with any questions or concerns. See DOE's FAQ for specific concerns regarding COVID-19 testing. Please note one consent form per student. Parents need to fill out a separate form for each student you have in the school.

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#### AP Exam Fee Reimbursement

If you paid and your student(s) took an AP Exam during the 2019-2020 school year, you must fill out this form in order to be reimbursed. This form must be filled out by October 9<sup>th</sup>. The form will not be available after October 9<sup>th</sup>. If you any questions, please contact APTesting@bths.edu for assistance.



# One School One Book





"How to Be an Antiracist" is an important book for examining racism, especially anti-Black racism. Thank you for those of you who have read the book. It is not a required book, and there are no prizes or awards for reading it. However, we hope that students, staff and parents will want to read it and join in conversations about it. You will keep hearing about this book at events and activities throughout the year, and it would be wonderful to have a common language for these conversations. Reading, thinking, writing and discussing help us understand and take antiracist actions. If you haven't read the book, please listen to Ibram X. Kendi online (there is a <u>Ted Talk</u> and many other recordings about "How to Be an Antiracist) which provides an introduction to the author's ideas. The ebook is available at the <u>public libraries</u> and <u>BTHS library</u>. Wait times are usually not as long as the estimates.
